Dear Colleagues,

It gives me great pleasure to invite you to the first advanced course on the health care of migrants and displaced populations “HEALTH ON THE MOVE” organized by the MSc “International Medicine / Health-Crisis Management of the University of Athens, School of Medicine.

Migrants, detainees, and ethnic minorities represent a vulnerable group within societies and a challenge for all health-care systems.

Due to their social and cultural peculiarities, but, above all, due to lack of appropriate legislation and the discriminatory or racist attitude of many health-care personnel, these migrant and displaced populations find themselves constantly denied their right to decent health care.

This advanced course aims to highlight the main health problems encountered within the groups of illegal aliens, refugees and marginalized migrants, displaced ethnic minorities, and detainees in refugee reception camps or in state prisons.

With this seminar we intend to offer more than a simple descriptive approach to the ever-growing health-care crisis within these populations but rather to discuss best practices and up-to-date methods for rapid diagnosis, effective screening and reliable access to stable and safe health care for these groups of people.

This high-level seminar is addressed to health workers dealing with migrants and refugees, with imprisoned or detained aliens and to those involved in street work and outreach programs of both public and non-governmental agencies.

I now welcome you and look forward to a fruitful exchange of ideas.
