

1st Advanced Course: Health on the move

The Advanced course has been designed for the 2nd year of the Curriculum of the MSc «International Medicine-Health Crisis management», School of Medicine-Athens University. However, it is an autonomous training module that can be offered to health professionals for a limited number of positions. The course is taught exclusively in English. The participants are awarded a training certificate following an evaluation process at the end of the course. Medical doctors, nurses and midwives can attend. Other profiles can be accepted based on their work experience and curriculum vitae.

- International legislation & humanitarian law
- The EU legislation and policies
- The case of Greece
- Legal, cultural and social issues in host countries: the access to health services
- Epidemiological profile
- Health priorities: HIV/AIDS, TB, Malaria, Mother & Child Health, Mental Health

The educational Objectives:

Participants at the end of the course should be able to:

- Define the causal relations and the dynamics of migration of populations on the move on a global and local scale
- Understand and apply the principles of International Law and EE regulations for refugees and migrant populations in Greece
- Approach and communicate the principles of cultural mediation and sensitivity in the context of their clinical practice
- Identify the basic epidemiological and socio-cultural characteristics of the main ethnic groups present in Greece
- Set the main priorities for public health targets affecting the health of populations on the move within the Greek context
- Describe and critically appraise the "Best Practices" for the health of populations on the move according to Greek and International literature and their applicability in the local context
